## A good Data Wall...

- is co-constructed
  - It doesn't look too neat and tidy...
  - Is this a one-person operation, or does everyone get involved?
- puts faces on the data... includes student photos
  - Unless you know that <u>all</u> the staff know all the students...
- changes often...
  - o If it doesn't, are the students learning?
  - What is the staff understanding around changes?
- · has a sense of progression in it
  - o Does it tell the story about advancement?
  - Does it show the interventions needed for the advancement?
- is accessible and accessed often
  - o Is it staffroom wallpaper, or a guide to action?
  - Is it a stimulus for teacher-learning? (cf. Timperley)
- is contested
  - o What is your evidence?
  - The aim isn't to "have a datawall". It's to engage together in the data
